During the storm of the 27th ult, the **Rose** and the **Revolution**, both of St Monance, Fife, fishing vessels, were wrecked on the island of Tyree. The crews—nine in number—fortunately were saved; but they lost every article of their property. The men have since been conveyed to Glasgow, from which they have obtained conveyance to their own homes at the expense of the Shipwrecked Seamen's Society. On the same day a fine brig belonging to Ireland, manned by Danes, was also lost on Tyree, but the crew escaped.
